\*Each Provisional will attend a monthly meeting of each of the following committees: Floral Design, Horticulture, Communications, Programme and Projects 5 half days to be selected by the Provisional

Monthly meetings are held the fourth Thursday of September, October, November, January, February, April and May. Although attendance is not compulsory, the meetings are the backbone of the Garden Club programme.

**NOTE:** Substantial completion of all of the above \*activities is required before a Provisional becomes an Active Member with voting rights. Activities may be completed over a 24-month period and certain other courses/activities may qualify.



### **What is the Garden Club of Toronto?**

- We are the only garden club in Canada that is a registered charity.
- Our 300 plus members share a passion for flowers, gardens, the environment and beautifying public spaces.
- We are co-founders of Canada Blooms with Landscape Ontario.
- Since inception in 1946, the Club has contributed to the betterment of Toronto through projects which include gardens at The Toronto Botanical Garden, St. James Cathedral, Casa Loma, Spadina House, June Callwood Park and Highway of Heroes to name a few.
- Scholarships are awarded annually to horticultural students at Fanshawe College, Humber College, University of Guelph and University of Toronto.
- We meet at the Toronto Botanical Garden, 777 Lawrence Ave. E., Toronto.
- Having incorporated in 1947, the Club is celebrating 70 years in 2017.

### **Some of the Benefits of Membership**

- We LEARN from experts by attending courses in floral design and horticulture, and from our speakers at our general meetings held from 12:30 to 2:30 on the fourth Thursday of the month in September, October, November, January, February, April and May.
- We GIVE BACK to the community through our involvement in charitable projects, maintaining specific public gardens (i.e., The Teaching Garden at The Toronto Botanical Gardens) Outreach programs such as Gilda's Place and by volunteering at Canada Blooms.
- We CREATE floral designs, plants, and gardens and have an opportunity to compete in floral design and horticultural shows.
- We PARTICIPATE in social events such as a December holiday party, luncheons, and trips of various lengths with a focus on gardens.

### **To become a member**

- Fill out the application form available on the Membership page on our website or pick one up from our office or a member.
- If you are acquainted with a current Garden Club member, please ask that person to act as your member contact.
- If you don't know a current member, we will arrange for you to meet with a member from our Membership Committee.

## Membership fees

- First year members, called Provisionals, pay \$325 to cover the cost of membership and courses in floral design and horticulture. An additional \$50 to \$100 should be budgeted for plant materials.
- After the first year, annual dues are \$225 (as of 2019) payable by May 31. Unlike donations, fees are not tax deductible.
- If an applicant who has paid fees and been accepted decides to withdraw
  - i. after August 15 but before the Provisional Programme begins, they will receive a refund of \$225 (\$325 less \$100 programme fee)
  - ii. after the start of the provisional programme, they will not receive a refund, but may defer their membership for one year.
- All requests for withdrawal must be made in writing to the Provisional Chair. Extenuating circumstances will be taken into consideration.

## Time commitment for Provisionals (new members)

- In your first year, you will set aside approximately 20 days, from September through June.
- All our events are held during the day. Some courses run from 9:30 am to 2:30 pm, others from 1:30 pm to 4:00 pm.
- September and October are especially hectic with a welcome lunch, garden visit, two horticulture sessions and a compulsory Floral Design course held on three consecutive Tuesday mornings.
- After completing all the requirements, the Provisional 'graduates' in May and becomes a member of the Club. If, for some reason, the Provisional is unable to complete all required activities, it is possible to extend their Provisional status for two years.

## Time commitment for members

- A member is expected to serve on at least one committee after completing the Provisional year. A minimum of 4 hours each month (excluding July and August) should be set aside for this.
- As a registered charity, with only one part-time employee, our activities are supported by Club members who serve on committees such as Awards, Canada Blooms, Floral Design, Horticulture, Membership, Provisionals, Programme and Projects.
- Provisionals attend meetings of most of our committees to enable them to decide which ones they would be interested in joining.
