PROVISIONAL ACTIVITIES

Substantial completion of these activities is required before a Provisional becomes an Active Member. Provisional and all club activities occur on weekdays during daytime hours. They may be completed over a 24-month period and certain other courses/activities may qualify. Specific dates will be distributed in late summer.

The Provisional must choose a second Horticulture course; course details will be available at the Orientation Meeting.

Each Provisional will attend one monthly meeting of five committees. This will be helpful when selecting a committee to join after graduation.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

General Meetings take place the afternoon of the fourth Thursday of September, October, November, January, February, April and May. Flower Shows are held the morning of each General Meeting, with the exception of February. Although attendance is not compulsory, the meetings are the backbone of the Garden Club of Toronto programme.

The Club offers many other educational and social events for members and there are many ways to get involved. More details will be available at the Orientation Meeting.



WHAT IS THE GARDEN CLUB OF TORONTO?

- We are the only garden club in Canada that is a registered charity.
- Our 300+ members share a passion for flowers, gardens, the environment and beautifying public spaces.
- We are co-founders of Canada Blooms with Landscape Ontario.
- Since inception in 1946, the Club has contributed to the betterment of Toronto through projects which include gardens at The Toronto Botanical Garden, St. James Cathedral, Casa Loma, Spadina House, June Callwood Park and Highway of Heroes to name a few.
- Scholarships are awarded annually to horticultural students at Fanshawe College, Humber College, University of Guelph and University of Toronto.
- We meet at the Toronto Botanical Garden, 777 Lawrence Ave. E., Toronto.
- The Club was incorporated in 1947.

SOME OF THE BENEFITS OF MEMBERSHIP

- We LEARN from experts by attending courses in floral design and horticulture, and from the speakers at our general meetings.
- We GIVE BACK to the community through our involvement in charitable projects, maintaining specific public gardens (e.g., The Teaching Garden at The Toronto Botanical Garden), Outreach programs such as Gilda's Place and by volunteering at Canada Blooms.
- We CREATE floral designs, plants, and gardens and have an opportunity to compete in floral design and horticultural shows.
- We PARTICIPATE in social events such as a December holiday party, luncheons, and trips of various lengths with a focus on gardens.

TO BECOME A MEMBER

- Complete the application form included in this package or use the online application available from our website (<https://thegardencluboftoronto.ca/page-18120>). Contact the office to have a form mailed to you if needed.
- If you are acquainted with a current Garden Club member, please ask that person to be your Member Contact. If you don't know a current member, we will arrange for you to connect with a member from our Membership Committee.
- Submit your completed application form and fees. Details on the Application Form.

MEMBERSHIP FEES

- First year members, called Provisionals, pay \$325 to cover the cost of membership and courses in floral design and horticulture. An additional \$50 to \$100 should be budgeted for plant materials.
- After the first year, annual dues are \$225 (as of 2021) payable by May 31. Unlike donations, fees are not tax deductible.
- If an applicant who has paid fees and been accepted decides to withdraw
 - i. after August 15 but before the Provisional programme begins, they will receive a refund of \$225 (\$325 less \$100 programme fee)
 - ii. after the start of the Provisional programme, they will not receive a refund, but may defer their membership for one year.
- All requests for withdrawal must be made in writing to the Provisional Chair. Extenuating circumstances will be taken into consideration.

TIME COMMITMENT FOR PROVISIONALS

- In your first year, you will set aside approximately 20 days, from September through June.
- All Provisional meetings and events are held on weekdays. Some courses run from 9:30 am to 2:30 pm, others from 1:30 pm to 4:00 pm. There are no evening or weekend activities.
- September and October are especially busy months with an Orientation session, a Welcome Lunch, a Horticulture session and a Floral Design course.
- After completing all the requirements, the Provisional 'graduates' in May and becomes a voting member of the Club. If, for some reason, the Provisional is unable to complete all required activities, it is possible to extend their Provisional status for two years.

TIME COMMITMENT FOR MEMBERS

- We are a registered charity, with one part-time employee. Our activities are supported by Club members who serve on committees such as Archives, Awards, Communications, Development, Floral Design, Horticulture, Membership, Provisional, Programme and Projects.
- Provisionals attend meetings of most of our committees to enable them to decide which ones they would be interested in joining.
- After completing the Provisional year, a member is expected to serve on at least one committee. A minimum of 4 hours each month (excluding July and August) should be set aside for this.
